Member of a Constitution Team which has taken the national championship each of the past ten years.

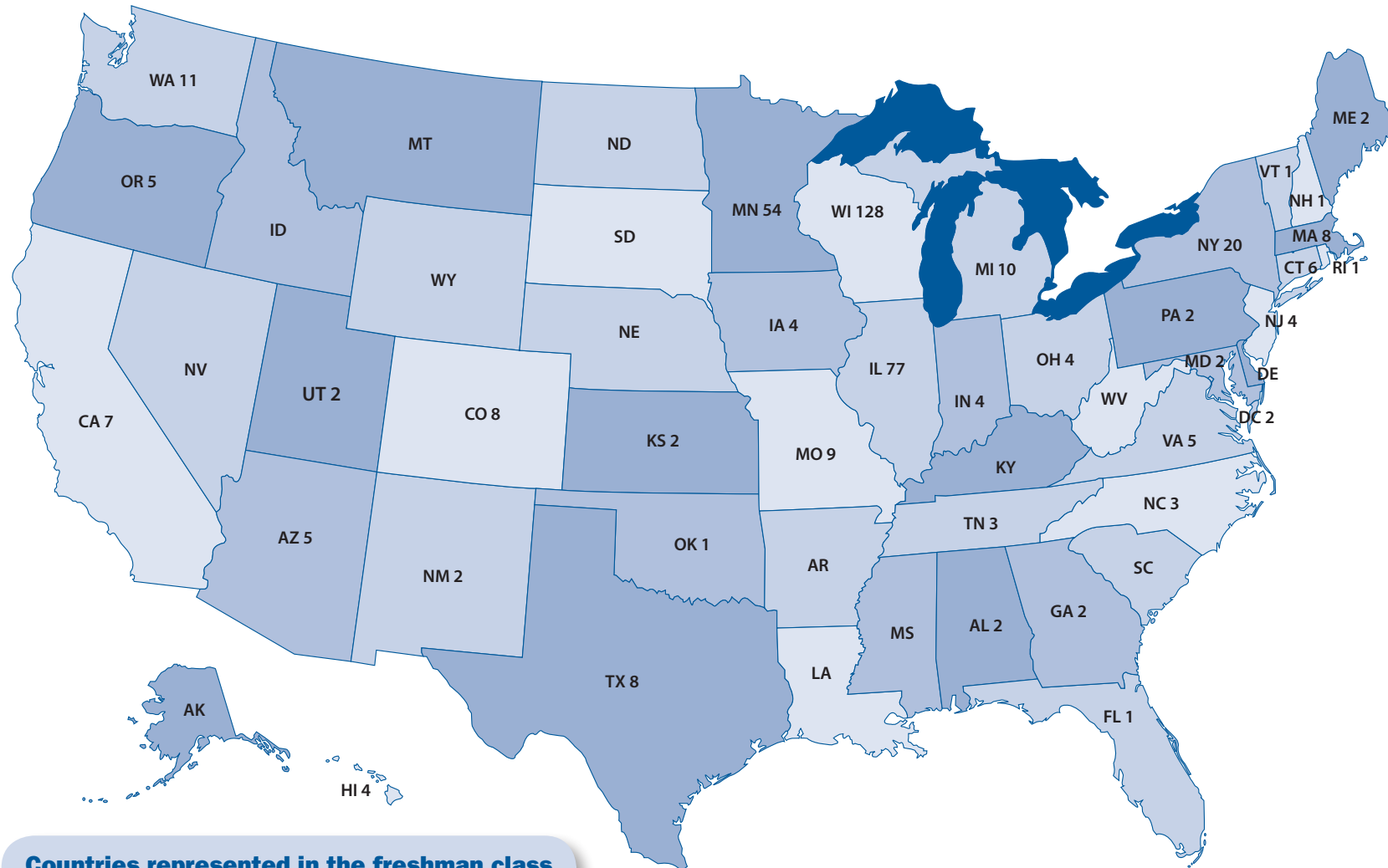
Produced and directed A Midsummer Night's Dream, giving all proceeds to "Adopt a Minefield."

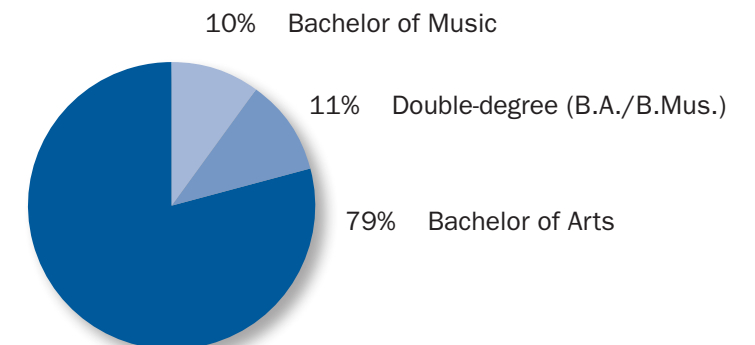
