Game Overview

Lawrence looks to get back on track as it heads north to Ashland to take on Northland.

Series History

Lawrence owns a 39-10-2 advantage over Northland. The Vikings have won 25 straight and 33 of the last 34 meetings.

The Coaches

Lawrence coach Mike Szkodzinski (St. Norbert '00) is in his fourth season behind the Vikings' bench. Szkodzinski owns a 46-49-7 record in Appleton.

Steve Fabilli is 11-112-3 in his fifth season in Ashland. Fabilli owns a 25-119-6 overall record.

Scouting the Vikings

Lawrence dropped a pair of games last weekend to MSOE. The Vikings fell 5-0 on Friday before dropping a heartbreaker on Saturday. MSOE scored a goal at the 18:31 mark of the third period for the win. Matt Hughes netted a goal and had an assist in Saturday's 3-2 loss.

Senior forward Marc Howe leads the Vikings' offense with 22 points (14 goals, eight assists). Ben DiMarco has 21 points (10 goals, 11 assists).

Evan Johnson is 7-8-1 between the pipes with a .406 goals against average and a .878 save percentage.

The Vikings are 17-for-98 (17.3 percent) on

the power play and 84-for-106 (79.2 percent) on the penalty kill.

Scouting the Pioneers

Northland enters the weekend 3-15-1 overall and 3-10-1 in the Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association. Northland earned a 8-2 victory and a 6-6 tie with Concordia (Wis.) last Friday and Saturday.

Northland is led in scoring by a pair of freshman. Kraig Wright has 22 points (10 goals, 12 assists), while Nick Hewko has 21 points (13 goals, eight assists.)

Daniel McIntosh is 3-12-1 in goal with a 5.81 goals against average and a .857 save percentage.

Northland is 17-for-98 (17.3 percent) on the power play and 82-for-111 (73.9 percent) on the penalty kill.

Century MARC

Senior forward Marc Howe played in his 100th career game in last Friday's 5-0 loss to MSOE. Howe has 106 career points (60 goals, 46 assists).

Elite Eight

Lawrence scored eight goals in each of the two wins in the weekend sweep of Northland on Nov. 20-21. It marks the first time Lawrence has scored eight or more goals in consecutive games in 11 years. Lawrence last posted eight goals in two consecutive games during the 1998-99 season where the Vikings defeated Illinois Benedictine 9-1 and 17-6 in a weekend series.

Penalty Shot Patter

Jonathan Bellotti scored on a penalty shot during the second period of Saturday's 8-2 loss. It was the first time a Lawrence player attempted a penalty shot since Jon Sheridan did so on Nov. 8, 2008 also against Adrian.

Like A Broken Record

Senior Marc Howe scored 3:41 into overtime in last Saturday's game to give Lawrence a 4-3 victory. With the goal, Howe became the Vikings' all-time leading scorer with 104 career points, passing Nick Jennette and Ryan Blick.

Working Overtime

Lawrence and Finlandia played two overtime games on Jan 15 and 16. It marks the first time Lawrence has skated an extra period in back-to-back games since the Vikings opened the 2004-05 season with ties against St. Scholastica and UW-Stout. Lawrence is 9-3-13 in its last 25 overtime games.

Good To Be Home

Lawrence is 29-15-5 in home games over the past three seasons. The Vikings are 13-6-1 in its last 20 games at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

MCHA Minute

Since November 15 of last season, Lawrence is 20-9-2 in its last 31 games against MCHA opponents. The Vikings finished with a 14-5-1 MCHA record a season ago.

Don't Have A Shot

Lawrence allowed just 19 shots in a 4-3 overtime win over Finlandia Jan. 16. With the win, the Vikings improved to 17-0-0 when allowing 19 shots or less under coach Mike Szkodzinski.

Rare Occurance

UW-Stevens Point's Luke Nesper missed a penalty shot in the Jan. 2 game at the Appleton Family Ice Center. It was the first penalty shot for a Lawrence opponent since Patrick Knutson took one for Minnesota-Crookston on Nov. 12, 2004.

Award Winners

A pair of Vikings earned MCHA awards for their efforts in the 3-2 season opening win over UW-Eau Claire on Oct. 31. Junior goaltender Evan Johnson was named Defensive Player of the Week after stopping 32-of-34 shots en route to his 19th career victory. It was the third time Johnson has earned the award in his career.

Freshman forward Brad Scurfield was named the Freshman of the Week after scoring his first collegiate goal against UW-Eau Claire. Scurfield buried a shot past Blugold goaltender Scott Pedersen to tie the game 1:11 into the third period.

Tough After 2

Lawrence is 35-1-0 when leading after two periods under Szkodzinski. The Vikings' only loss came in a 6-3 defeat at UW-Eau Claire during the 2007-08 season. Eau Claire scored five unanswered goals in the contest.

Four Or More

Lawrence is unbeaten in its last 35 games when scoring four goals or more under Szkodzinski. Overall, Lawrence is 36-2-3 when scoring four goals or more since the 2006-07 season.

Lawrence is 23-0-1 when scoring five goals or more over the past three seasons.

Nifty Fifty

Lawrence head coach Mike Szkodzinski needs only 4 wins to give him 50 for his career. Currently second on the Lawrence career wins list, Szkodzinski is only 6 victories away from becoming the school's all-time leader in wins. Dave Ruhly, head coach from 1999-2006, owns a 51-119-10 career record.

Lawrence finished the 2006-07 campaign 13-14-2, Szkodzinski's first season in Appleton. The Vikings went 10-14-3 in 2008 before posting a school-record 16 wins during

Record Breaker

With his goal at the 14:54 mark of the first period in the 4-2 victory over Concordia (Wis.) on Nov. 7, senior forward Marc Howe became Lawrence's all-time goal scoring leader. With 49 career goals, Howe passed former Vikings Nick Jennette and Mike Burkhart.

Howe currently has 104 career points, passing Nick Jennette and Ryan Blick on the Lawrence all-time scoring list.

Northern Lights

Lawrence's 3-2 victory over UW-Eau Claire

last Friday was its first win in three tries against the Blugolds. It was only the fourth time in school history the Vikings have ever beaten a Northern Collegiate Hockey Association opponent.

Fully Automatic

For the first time in the 11-year history of the Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association, the league's Harris Cup champion will receive an automatic trip into the NCAA Division III tournament field.

The MCHA has never had an at-large selection in the NCAA tournament despite strong seasons recently. In 2006, Milwaukee School of Engineering finished 21-5-1. Adrian College finished 26-3 in 2008 and 27-1-1 last season.

National Leader

Junior goaltender Evan Johnson led the nation with seven shutouts in 2008-09. The seven shutouts placed Johnson second on the all-time shutouts list for a single-season in NCAA Division III history, trailing only St. Norbert's Kyle Jones. Jones posted 10 shutouts in 2007-08.

Johnson added to his already stellar year by setting single-season records with a 13-9-1 record, 2.11 goals against average and .912 save percentage.

Going Pro

Former Lawrence all-time leader in points and goals Nick Jennette inked a professional contract with the Huntsville Havoc of the Southern Professional Hockey League at the conclusion of the 2008-09 season. Jennette set the NCAA Division III record with 111 consecutive games played.

Freshman Firsts

Lawrence freshman Brad Scurfield became the first Viking player to score a goal in his first collegiate game since current Viking Billy Siers light the lamp in a 4-1 loss to UW-Stout to open the 2006-07 season.

Fellow freshman Gustav Ahlberg assisted on Ben DiMarco's power-play goal in the first period of the 3-2 win over UW-Eau Claire last Friday. The assist was Ahlberg's first career point.

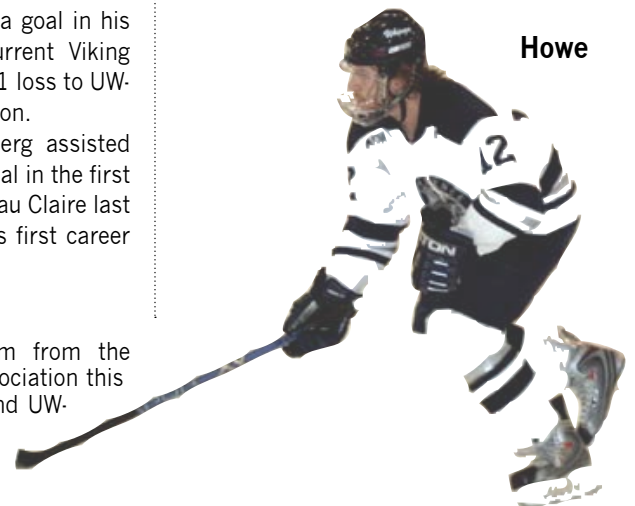

Lawrence skaters travel to Europe for trio of exhibition games

APPLETON, Wis. -- Not to get all Star Trek on everyone, but the Lawrence University hockey team is about to go where no Vikings have gone before.

The Vikings left for Europe on Nov. 30 for an eight-day, three-game trip, and this marks the first time a Lawrence team has ever gone overseas to compete.

"Not only will the team get to see what it is like to play hockey in three different countries, they will also have the priceless experience of engaging in other cultures," Lawrence coach Mike Szkodzinski said. "This trip will definitely be an irreplaceable memory for all of us."

With Lawrence's new academic calendar this year, the Vikings were looking at a break of more than a month from late November until early January. Szkodzinski saw this as an opportunity to give his team a new experience. NCAA rules allow teams to travel overseas to compete in exhibition games once every four years. The entire team and two sets of parents are set to visit Italy, France and Switzerland and play three club teams.

"This will be a phenomenal experience for the players, coaches and parents," Szkodzinski said. "This is a once-in-a-lifetime trip that will hopefully continue to build upon the strong bond that this group seems to have already."

The Vikings raised the money needed for the trip through a large raffle, and they received a generous donation from a former Lawrence hockey player.

"To have 28 of your best buddies, the whole hockey team, going to Europe, it can get better than that," said senior defenseman

and team captain Mike Ackley.

The trip should allow the Vikings to stay sharp after a great start to the season. Lawrence headed into play at this weekend's Thanksgiving Showcase at St. Scholastica with a 6-1-0 record, including a 5-0-0 mark in Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association play.

"It's pretty much two seasons with the split (in the schedule)," Ackley said. "We've got to combine that by throwing some games in there. By doing this it's perfect. ... With playing games (in Europe), you get that game experience and you keep that positive momentum going so that will be great."

Lawrence faces HC Ascona in Milan on Dec. 1 and then visits the site of the 2006 Winter Olympic Games at Torino. The Vikings then travel to

France for a game in Chambéry against HC Val d'Aoste on Dec. 3 and a visit to Chamonix, site of the 1924 Winter Games. The Vikings also will visit Lausanne, Switzerland, for a visit to the Olympic Museum and a game in Lucerne against the SISEC Selects Team before returning home.

"We've all been talking about how this will be one of those best times of our lives," Ackley said.

sion title last season.

"Our program over the past three seasons has been very positive," Szkodzinski said. "We are proud of the way our student-athletes have represented themselves and the program. On ice, we have become a very difficult team to play against night in and night out. Off ice, our players have built a reputation of being very disciplined and focused. We are looking forward to continuing that path and becoming a consistent contender for the MCHA championship."

A native of Brighton, Mich., Szkodzinski played two seasons at Ferris State University, earning All-Central Collegiate Hockey Association Rookie Team honor in 1997. He transferred to St. Norbert and was a standout goaltender. He was second-team American Hockey Coaches Association All-American in 1999 and earned first-team All-Northern Collegiate Hockey Association honors in 1999 and 2000.

Szkodzinski put together an impressive 2.21 career goals against average and still holds the school record with a .917 save percentage. He compiled a 32-9-4 record between the pipes, and included in that total is a 4-2 win in the 1999 NCAA Division III Tournament over Middlebury College.

After earning a bachelor's degree in business administration from St. Norbert, Szkodzinski went on to serve as an assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin Eau Claire for the 2001-2 season. He then spent two seasons as an assistant at the University of Findlay, where he received a Master of Business Administration degree. Szkodzinski then worked as an assistant at St. Norbert before being hired as Lawrence's head coach

"I have gained valuable experience at elite levels of college hockey because of the coaches with whom I have worked before coming to Lawrence," he said. "All of them gave me the reins in nearly every aspect of coaching, and I will continue to utilize those experiences down the road."

Szkodzinski also believes working at both the Division III level (St. Norbert, UW-Eau Claire) and the Division I level (Findlay) is a valuable asset.
