Small groups of intermediate and advanced players delve into the repertoire and techniques of chamber music literature. Ensembles are formed based on age, ability, experience and instrumentation to ensure skill-level compatibility. Classes are taught by skilled, inspiring, widely respected teachers in a setting designed to foster musical creativity, self-confidence, and the ability to make music with others.

- Sight singing
- "Fingerboard Geography," a hands-on approach to music theory for string players
- Score reading and sight reading classes for pianists
- String orchestra

Chamber Music Odyssey is open to students ages 11-18. Violin students must be performing at WSMA level A, viola and cello students performing at WSMA level A or B, and high school piano students performing at WSMA level A with fluency in sight reading and upon the recommendation of their piano teachers.
