

# LAWRENCE ACADEMY OF MUSIC CAMP

July 17-23, 2011

## GENERAL INFORMATION

- DIRECTIONS TO CAMP** See enclosed map. If you plan to use public transportation, please make arrangements with the Lawrence Academy of Music office prior to June 15, 2011. If you are a high school student driving your own car to campus, you must make parking arrangements in advance with the Academy office.
- CHECK-IN/REGISTRATION (for resident campers)** Begins at 12:00 noon and continues until 3:00 p.m. You will be sent your residence hall assignment, audition time, and theory test time about two weeks prior to camp. When you arrive at camp, please go directly to your assigned residence hall. After checking in at your room, you may go to your audition location. There will be tours of campus and orientation sessions scheduled on Sunday afternoon, especially designed for all new campers.
- LATE REGISTRATIONS** All registrations after June 15, 2011 must be accompanied by full payment of camp fees. If for any reason you have not received your final confirmation letter and residence hall assignment, come to the Camp Office at Lawrence University Music Drama Center, Room 142 to get your assignments.
- AUDITIONS** Auditions for band placement will be held on Sunday afternoon after check-in. The audition will take about five minutes. Please prepare a solo or an etude from a lesson book (it doesn't have to be a lengthy piece), major scales in Bb, Ab, and F concert, a chromatic scale, and be prepared to do some sight-reading. Prepare before camp so you are able to play and rehearse up to 4 hours per day. Jazz ensemble auditions (for those choosing this class) will be held separately from your band audition. For this, prepare a short jazz-style solo and be prepared to sight-read some jazz music. Piano, bass, guitar, and drum set performers are needed as well as wind players.
- SUNDAY LUNCH** There are many restaurants nearby at which parents and students may have Sunday lunch. Please do so prior to registration. We ask that once a student arrives at camp and is registered that he/she remains on campus until the close of music camp on Saturday, July 23.
- CAMP BOUNDARIES** For your safety please remain within the boundaries of the camp after you register. These are shown on the campus map enclosed. College Avenue is a very busy street. Use the stoplighted crosswalks at the corners near Drew St. and Lawe St. Violation of camp boundaries is a serious matter and may result in dismissal from camp.
- FULL CAMP MEETING** A meeting of all students and staff will be held Sunday evening. Camp rules and procedures will be fully explained, the camp faculty and counselors will be introduced, and band rosters will be read. Following the meeting you will have your first full band rehearsal.
- HEALTH FORM** If you have not returned the health form by mail, it must be given to your Head Counselor on registration day. **No camper will be allowed to remain on campus without a signed health form granting permission for medical professionals to render treatment in emergencies. If you have questions regarding the health form, please contact the Academy Office (address below). Be sure to complete the entire form with parent signature.**

- Locations of activities may change prior to camp. Review the schedule at your Sunday afternoon registration area. Campers' families and friends are encouraged to attend the Saturday concerts and are welcome at all others. Students check out of their residence halls immediately after the morning concert.
- HONORS RECITAL** Prepare literature of WSMA Class B or A difficulty; auditions are held Monday and Tuesday evenings; the camp will provide accompanists. If your piece requires piano accompaniment, be sure to bring the piano part with you. Further information on the Honors Recital is posted on our website (see address on reverse side).
- CAMP AWARDS** Honors Recital – First Place: Full 2012 Camp Scholarship. Second Place: Half 2012 Camp Scholarship  
Camper of the Week: 2 Recipients – A full 2012 Camp Scholarship for each recipient and an additional full scholarship for their school.  
Certificate of Merit for Outstanding Participation, National Band Association: Awarded to one student per band.

<b>EQUIPMENT</b>	Have your instrument in good working condition. Be sure your instrument has an identification tag with your name and address. Bring specific music/props as you wish for lessons, student talent show, and honors recital.
<b>ATTIRE/PACKING LIST</b>	See attached packing list. Campus buildings used daily are air-conditioned; bring layers to wear in cool rooms. The residence halls are not air-conditioned, so you may want to bring an electric fan.  Daytime – casual-pants/jeans/shorts/t-shirt/sweatshirt. You will need to walk between buildings, so bring appropriate and comfortable footwear for walking. Evening – Since each evening brings concerts and recitals and the performers will be dressed up, it is our tradition that campers also dress in a manner that shows support of their fellow performers. There will be time to change each evening after dinner.  Concert attire for Saturday morning: Girls: Dark blue or black skirt or pants; white blouse or top (no tank tops or halters) Boys: White dress shirt or polo shirt; black or dark blue dress slacks (no jeans), dark shoes, dark socks
<b>RESIDENCE HALLS</b>	Campers will be housed in Sage Hall and Ormsby Hall. The first class each day (Monday – Friday) begins at 8:30; the last class ends at 4:20; evening activities follow dinner each night. These are very full days, so please respect the 11:00 p.m. “lights out” time. You don’t have to stay up until “lights out!” Counselors will check rooms shortly after 11:00 each night.
<b>MEALS</b>	Meals will be served at the Warch Campus Center. Please indicate any food allergies on your health form. If you need a special diet, please send it to the Lawrence Academy of Music office by June 15 so that we may inform our dietitian.
<b>MEDICAL CARE</b>	Leaving camp due to illness must be arranged through the camp medical staff and camp director (parents must notify the camp administration before taking a student home). The camp has a Red Cross certified emergency responder on site for the entire duration of the camp. Emergency medical service is available 24 hours a day.
<b>CELL PHONES</b>	You may bring a cell phone to camp, but it must be kept and used only in your dorm room. Please do not bring it with you to class or rehearsals. Counselors may confiscate phones of students who abuse this rule (phones will be returned at the end of the week). Put a nametag on your phone so we can identify it if lost. Other electronic devices (iPods, laptops, etc.) may be brought to camp, but are subject to the above cell phone rules if they become a disruption to other students or staff.
<b>VISITORS</b>	Parents and band directors may visit at any time. Other guests are welcome at concert and program events.
<b>PUBLICITY</b>	Lawrence Academy of Music often visually records lessons, classes and public occasions. These images as well as information about student, teacher and staff activities are published regularly as part of coverage of the Academy of Music. Publications include print media, such as brochures, advertising, the Academy newsletter, and the Academy's website. Images and information featuring registered students and staff are considered eligible for publication or public use unless the student (or parent/guardian of students under 18) submits a request for non-disclosure in writing to the Academy of Music office prior to the publication date. Contact the Academy of Music office to request a non-disclosure form. Students must complete a new form each year.
<b>MISCELLANEOUS</b>	Snacks are available from vending machines in the residence halls or you may bring your own snacks. Smoking or use of drugs or alcohol is not permitted. Firearms, knives, and weapons are strictly prohibited on the Lawrence University campus.
<b>REFUNDS</b>	The \$75.00 Registration Fee is non-refundable. <b>NO REFUNDS OF THE BALANCE OF THE CAMP FEES FOR CANCELLATIONS AFTER JUNE 15, 2011.</b> Exceptions: serious illness, hospitalization, or death.
