Do you want to get connected to the Volunteer and Community Service Center?

Find out how to get involved and how it can benefit you below!

- We've changed our staffing to better serve you and your organizations! We now have two Student Organization Coordinators. Their main job is to help support collaboration among student groups, and facilitate your volunteer activities in the community.

- Attend a service council meeting! Service council exists to connect student groups in their initiatives, to find ways to work together, and to learn about what's going on in the Lawrence community. There are often community and campus leaders who speak at service council, willing to give their insight into our needs.

- It's really important to log volunteer hours, even if the process is tedious. Here are 3 good reasons to log your volunteer hours:
  - Your student organization can be credited for members' volunteer work – and each member's work will be credited on their co-curricular transcript.
  - The information provided allows us to fully capture the service story at Lawrence, and recognize the amazing efforts of all Lawrentians and share the information with the community at large.
  - It provides a record for future leaders of your organization – we keep records year to year of your volunteer activities.
- We can connect your service initiatives to community organizations to enhance your events. For last year's Take Back The Night event, we connected the Amnesty International student group to Harbor House and the Christine Ann Center, and these community organizations provided them with free banners and signs.
