Description:

Heckrodt Wetland Reserve is a 76-acre urban nature reserve with habitats that include forested wetland, cattail marsh, open water and fields, and upland forest. Heckrodt strives to enhance, restore, and preserve the wetland and educate all people on the importance of conserving natural resources. Heckrodt is an ideal place for volunteers who are interested in environment and who enjoy outdoor activities.

Directions:

Head west on E College Ave. and turn left at S Appleton St., continue onto S Oneida St. for about 3.3 miles. Turn right at WI-114 Trunk W/Co Rd JJ/Plank Rd. Destination is on the left.

Volunteer Opportunities:

Volunteers are needed for land management activities such as raking, removing debris, clearing invasive species, feeding birds and deer, and clearing trails. Teacher-Naturalists are also needed to teach environmental education programs, assist with school, scout, and other educational programs for children. Special event volunteers are needed for a variety of activities, including being a Nature Center Sitter while staff is teaching programs, popping popcorn on movie nights, making and wrapping gifts, and other diverse activities.

Qualifications/requirements:

Heckrodt will provide teacher-Naturalist training, as well as instruction for other jobs.

Time Commitment:

Teacher-Naturalists must be able to dedicate time to teaching twice per term. Programs generally run for 2 hours. Other volunteer opportunities are flexible depending on volunteer's schedule.
