INSTRUCTIONS FOR NON-DEGREE APPLICANTS 2017-2018

Thank you for your interest in taking courses non-degree at Lawrence University. There is no application fee required for non-degree candidates, but there is a \$20 matriculation fee, which is payable at registration. (Please do not submit this fee with your application.) Although Lawrence financial aid is not available to non-degree-seeking students, some students may qualify for loan programs. For more details, please contact our financial aid office at 920-832-6583.

The class schedule, available at http://www.lawrence.edu/dept/registrar/class_schedules.shtml, is your source of information about classes, what term they are offered, at what time, and the name of the instructor. **You will refer to this site throughout your application process.**

COURSES FOR CREDIT

If you wish to take individual courses for credit, you are responsible for submitting (or arranging for the submission of) the following:

- Application for Admission, Non-degree Status
- Official transcripts of all previous high school and college work
- Written permission from the professor(s) of the course(s) you wish to attend. We suggest you contact the professor prior to application to determine space availability, prerequisites, and other factors. (Faculty email addresses are available at find.lawrence.edu). In courses with limited enrollment, full-time Lawrence students have priority over non-degree special students.
- Conservatory of Music lessons **cannot** be taken for credit.
- Independent and Direct Study, Internships and Tutorials **cannot** be taken for credit.

Note: Admission to the non-degree program does not in itself constitute eligibility for a specific course.

Lawrence graduates and matriculants who are not currently enrolled, should contact the Registrar at 920-832-6578 for information about taking courses as a special student. You do not have to apply through the Office of Admissions. Non-degree-seeking students who wish to become degree-seeking candidates must apply for regular admission through the Office of Admission, using the standard application procedures.

AUDIT CREDIT

If you wish to audit a course (i.e., you will be an observer only; no papers, exams, or other class work will be submitted; and no credit will be earned), you will need to complete and submit an Application for Admission, Non-degree Status. A transcript of previous college work is not required. Tuition to audit a course at Lawrence is \$202 per course with a one-time \$20 Matriculation fee.

Not all courses may be audited. Conservatory of Music lessons, art lessons, tutorials, directed study and beginning level language courses **cannot** be audited.

Audit students will be accommodated only on a space-available basis and may not advance register for classes. Registration information will be mailed to admitted students approximately two weeks before the term begins. Students must attend the first class meeting to see if a seat is available and obtain the written approval of the instructor before they can register for the class.

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

If you wish to enroll at Lawrence to fulfill requirements for secondary teaching certification in Wisconsin, you should first consult with the Lawrence Education Department at 920-832-6714. You must also submit the following:

- Application for Admission, Non-degree Status
- Official transcripts of all previous high school and college work
- Permission from the Lawrence Education Department faculty to enroll

Admission to the non-degree program does not imply or guarantee acceptance into the Teacher Certification program. Candidates are reviewed by the Faculty Committee on Teacher Education. Fee information is available from the Education Department.

THE ACADEMY PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Academically qualified juniors and seniors currently in Fox Cities-area high schools may enroll in one course per term with permission of the course instructor. To apply, you must submit the following:

- Academy Application
- Official high school transcript
- Official ACT or SAT (or PLAN or PSAT) scores, if available
- Guidance counselor recommendation.

Information on the Academy Program is available from your high school's guidance office or from the Lawrence University Office of Admissions. Current tuition is approximately \$1,109 per credit course and is subject to change. You must arrange payment for the course either through the Post Secondary Enrollment Options program or on your own.

Note: This program is distinct from the **Lawrence Academy of Music**. Sponsored through the Conservatory of Music, the Academy of Music provides music instruction to members of the Lawrence and Fox Valley communities and offers special programs on arts-related topics. Instructors are Lawrence faculty, students, and qualified specialists in particular areas of music. Academy of Music participation is not handled through the Office of Admissions. You must secure written permission from the instructor(s) for each course(s) you wish to take. Upon receiving his/her approval, have the professor forward permission in a memorandum format to the director of admissions.

A matriculation fee of \$20 (a one-time only charge to cover the cost of establishing an academic record) is required of all students at registration. Course fee may be found in the course catalog. Do NOT submit this fee with this application.

Lawrence University faculty and staff members and their dependents should consult the personnel manual to determine potential tuition benefits. Please contact the Office of Human Resources to verify eligibility.

Transcripts of all high school and/or previous college work are required only for non-degree-seeking students opting to take a course for academic credit and for those students seeking teacher certification.

Inquiries about teacher certification should be directed to the education department. A transcript will be required.
