Lawrence University 75-Day Report July 7, 2020

Section 18004(e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act" or the "Act")), Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (March 27, 2020), directs institutions receiving funds under Section 18004 of the Act to submit (in a time and manner required by the Secretary) a report to the Secretary describing the use of funds distributed from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund ("HEERF").

In compliance with Section 18004(e) of the CARES Act, the following is Lawrence University's 30-day report:

- 1. Lawrence University signed and returned to the Department of Education (DOE) the Certification and Agreement on April 14, 2020. By doing so, Lawrence assures that it will use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 2. Lawrence University received \$578,814 from DOE on April 24, 2020, pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- 3. Lawrence University has distributed \$555,796 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of July 7, 2020 (within 75 days of the award allocation).
- 4. We estimate 990 students are eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 5. As of July 7, 2020, 363 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act (within 75 days of the award allocation).
- 6. The methods used by Lawrence University to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act are as follows:

In order to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants, students must complete the COVID-19 Emergency Grants application. To be eligible for funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act, students must also have a valid 2019-20 FAFSA on file with the Lawrence University Financial Aid Office. The amount of the grant is based on the amount of eligible expenses reported on the application. Emergency grant amounts for Pell Grant recipients range from a minimum of \$1,250 to a maximum of \$2,500. For students who do not qualify for the Pell Grant, emergency grant amounts range from a minimum of \$250 to a maximum of \$2,500.

7. The instructions, directions, or guidance provided to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants are as follows:

Students were sent a series of emails and institutional announcements beginning May 1, 2020 encouraging them to apply by May 8, 2020 for priority consideration. A second reminder was sent on May 8, 2020 encouraging students to apply by May 18, 2020. The final deadline to apply for funding to cover expenses incurred during Spring Term 2020 was May 29, 2020. Emergency Financial Aid Grants are awarded on a first-come basis for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus (including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance) that were incurred during Spring Term 2020.
