

INSTRUCTIONS FOR NON-DEGREE APPLICANTS 2023-2024

Thank you for your interest in taking courses non-degree at Lawrence University. No application fee is required for non-degree candidates. Tuition rates are noted below. Although Lawrence financial aid is not available to non-degree-seeking students, some students may qualify for loan programs. For more details, please contact our financial aid office at 920-832-6583. This application is intended only for students who have never taken course(s) at Lawrence. If you have taken courses at Lawrence in the past, you can complete the <u>Non-Degree Seeking Reinstatement Form</u>. Non-degree seeking students should apply no later than 2 weeks prior to the beginning of the applicable term.

The class schedule, available at <u>http://www.lawrence.edu/dept/registrar/class_schedules.shtml</u>, is your source of information about courses, terms they are offered, time, instructor names. **You will refer to this site throughout your application process.**

COURSES FOR CREDIT

If you wish to take individual courses for credit, you are responsible for submitting the following:

- Application for Admission, Non-degree Status
- Official transcripts of all previous high school and college work

In courses with enrollment limits, instructors will determine if there is seat availability for non-degree seeking students. If seat availability is confirmed by the instructor prior to the start of the term, the student will be registered in the course. Registration information will be emailed to admitted students prior to the term start date. If registration is pending based on seat availability, students must attend the first class meeting to see if a seat is available. If the instructor confirms seat availability, the instructor will need to notify the registrar's office of the approval. The student will be responsible for following up with the registrar's office to ensure they are officially registered in the course prior to the end of add/drop (5:00pm on the 5th day of the term).

Not all courses are available to non-degree seeking students.

The following courses are not available to non-degree seeking students:

- Conservatory of Music lessons
- Independent and Direct Study, Internships and Tutorials
- Other courses as determined by instructors/department chairs

Note: Admission to the non-degree program does not in itself constitute eligibility for a specific course.

AUDIT CREDIT

If you wish to audit a course (i.e., you will be an observer only; no papers, exams, or other class work will be submitted; and no credit will be earned), you will need to submit an Application for Admission, Non-degree Status. A transcript of previous college work is not required. Tuition to audit a course at Lawrence is \$244 per course.

Due to the interactive nature of some courses, not all courses may be audited. Conservatory of Music lessons, art lessons, tutorials, directed study, beginning level language and interactive courses as determined by faculty may not be audited. Auditors will be accommodated only on a space-available basis. If advance registration is approved by the instructor, the student will be registered as an auditor in the course and registration information will be emailed to admitted students prior to the term start date. If registration is pending based on seat availability, students must attend the first class meeting to see if a seat is available. If the instructor confirms seat availability, the instructor will need to notify the registrar's office. The student will be responsible for following up with the registrar's office to ensure they are officially registered in the course prior to the end of add/drop (5:00pm on the 5th day of the term).

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

If you wish to enroll at Lawrence to fulfill requirements for secondary teaching certification in Wisconsin, you should first consult with the Lawrence Education Department at 920-832-6714. You must also submit the following:

- Application for Admission, Non-degree Status
- Official transcripts of all previous college work
- Permission from the Lawrence Education Department faculty to enroll

Admission to the non-degree program does not imply or guarantee acceptance into the Teacher Certification program. Candidates are reviewed by the Faculty Committee on Teacher Education. Fee information is available from the Education Department.
