We will learn how to make spore prints and learn some ways we can do artwork with mushrooms and these prints.

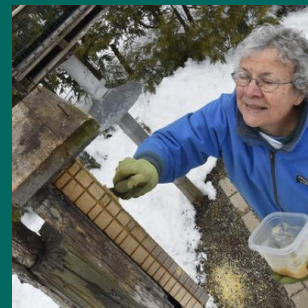
Expect some walking into wet areas on our field trips to study these plants, so bring waterproof hiking boots and perhaps a hiking pole for steady travel.
