Over five days we will read and discuss five key works of literature, engaging in deep discussions exploring what we can learn from them to improve civic participation in the life of our communities today. We will read across history, and will include both fiction and non-fiction.

The week will begin with the classic novel Fahrenheit 451 by Ray Bradbury, followed by Zora Neale Hurston's short story collection, *Hitting a Straight Lick with a Crooked Stick*. Next will be *The Persuaders* by Anand Giridharadas, followed by *Julius Caesar* by William Shakespeare. We will close the week on a note of hope with *On Tyranny* by Timothy Snyder.
