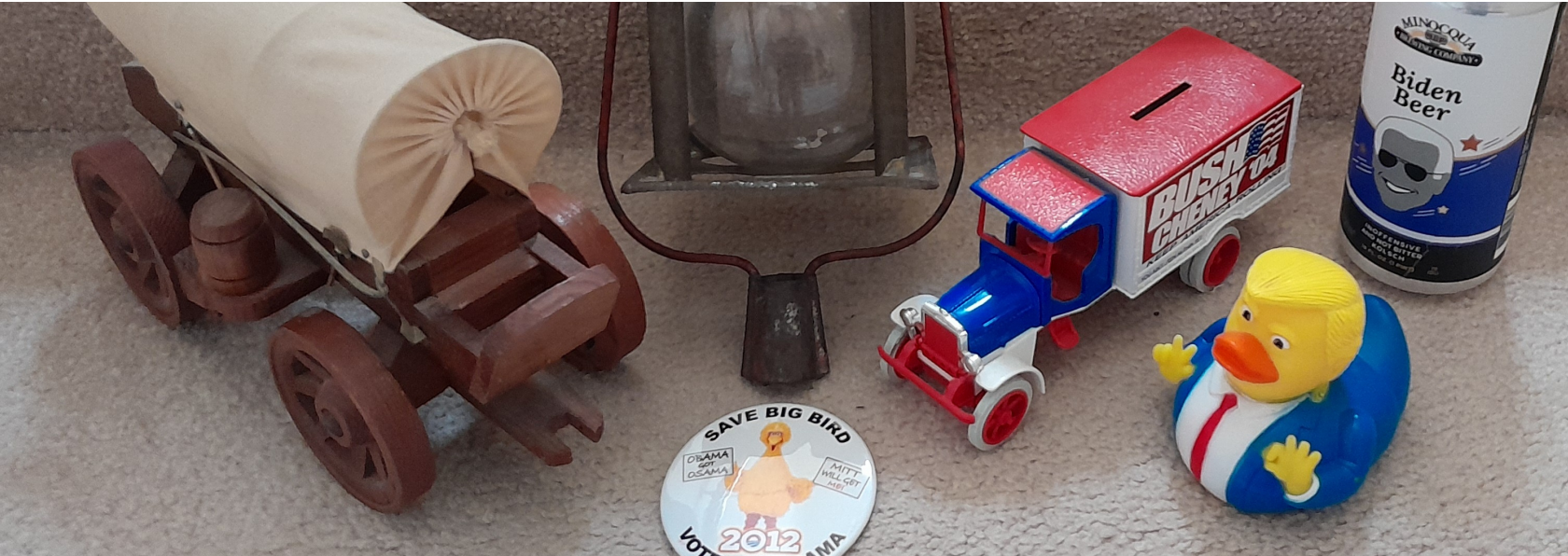

The 2024 election – unprecedented or un-president-ed? The candidates, the campaigns, the issues ... new stuff, or just recycled?

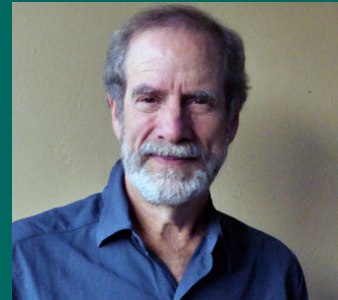

Hon. Charles B. Schudson is a Wisconsin Reserve Judge Emeritus, a former state/federal prosecutor, trial/appellate judge, and Fulbright Scholar.

For many years he served on the faculties of the Marquette University Law School and the University of Wisconsin Law School. He also was Lawrence University's Law and Literature Scholar in Residence.

Schudson has authored many published works including: *On Trial / America's Courts and Their Treatment of Sexually Abused Children* and the award-winning *Independence Corrupted / How America's Judges Make Their Decisions*.

In 2006, he served as an International Observer for the Venezuelan presidential election. He has been a featured guest on NPR, PBS, and Oprah. This will be his 14th Björklunden seminar.
