Membership in honorary societies is designated by cords worn on the gowns of five groups of graduates. Members of Phi Beta Kappa, the nation's most prestigious academic honor society, wear cords of pink and sky blue, the society's official colors. Members of the Mortar Board, the senior honor society, wear cords of silver and gold signifying opportunity and achievement. Seniors who were members of the sophomore honor society Lambda Sigma wear royal blue and gold honor cords signifying truth and honor. Members of Sigma Alpha Iota, the international music fraternity for women, wear red and white honor cords representing membership, leadership, and service by women in the musical arts. Members of Pi Kappa Lambda, the national music honor society, wear cords of gold and white, the society's official colors, signifying the highest achievement in music. Members of Phi Alpha Theta, the national history honor society, wear red and light blue cords symbolizing the relation between humans and the infinite. Alpha Alpha Alpha recognizes the academic excellence of first-generation college students and its members wear cords of blue and grey.

Students graduating with cum laude honors wear a single gold cord representing their distinguished academic accomplishments.

Members of the Class Leadership Team wear a single cord in their Class Color to recognize their leadership of the senior class and to represent the guidance they will provide in the years ahead as alumni.

Members of the Honor Council wear a single cord of royal purple intertwined with gold. The purple stands for honor and the gold symbolizes the Golden Rule.
